Mike's legal career has focused on taking complex cases to trial. His docket regularly includes all types of business disputes, including prosecuting and defending lawsuits for technology companies, governmental entities, oil and gas companies and government contractors. For the last 12 years, Mike has tried jury trials and arbitrated disputes in Texas and around the country.

Prior to returning to his home state of Texas in 2013, Mike served as an Assistant United States Attorney ("AUSA") at the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District of California. As an AUSA in the Major Frauds and Special Prosecutions Section, Mike prosecuted a wide range of complex matters, including public corruption, Foreign Corrupt Practices Act violations (related to a Fortune 500 Company), wire fraud and mortgage fraud. Mike also tried five cases to verdict and argued in front of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.

From 2005-2008, Mike was an associate at Bartlit Beck Herman Palenchar & Scott, a trial-based national litigation boutique in Chicago. At the firm, he participated in two jury trials and one arbitration.

After graduating from Stanford Law School, Mike served as a law clerk at the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California for the Honorable Susan Y. Illston.
